

RULES

1. Entries are open to the public.
2. Entries will be accepted from 6:30 a.m. until 9:30 a.m. on Friday - April 11, 1975.
3. Containers will be furnished except for artistic classes.
4. Exhibitors may enter more than one specimen in a class, but entries must be different named varieties.
5. All exhibits must be named and labeled. Entry tags are available beforehand from Floyd Wickenkamp 997-2354 and Bobbe Shepard 274-6285.
6. Horticulture exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor.
7. Juniors are those under 18 years of age.
8. The committee may combine or separate classes where necessary.
9. Judging will be by A.I.S. rules; decisions of the judges are final.
10. Sun Country will take precautions to prevent injury or loss to exhibits; however, the Society assumes no responsibility.
11. Faded stalks will be groomed or removed after judging by the show committee.
12. Judging will commence promptly at 11:00 a.m. on Friday, April 11, 1975.
13. Trophies will be awarded Saturday at 4:30 p.m., April 12, 1975. Ribbons and trophies must be removed between 5:00 and 6:00 p.m. on this day.

## DIVISION II ARTISTIC DESIGN

### RULES

1. One entry to a class.
2. No artificial flowers or foliage may be used.
3. Flowers need not have been grown by the exhibitor.
4. Exhibitor's name must be on bottom of container.
5. Some iris must be used in all classes.
6. Exhibitor must freshen flowers.
7. Exhibits must be picked up between 5:00 and 6:00 on Saturday, April 12th.
8. Junior - Anyone under 18 years of age.

1. DINNER AT EIGHT -  
to be a centerpiece
2. WELCOME -  
tall arrangement for entry hall, featuring beardless iris
3. SCANDINAVIAN BUFFET -  
one sided arrangement, featuring bulbous iris
4. PINNACLE PEAK PATIO -  
table arrangement for patio party, accessories permitted
5. HOME ON THE RANGE -  
kitchen arrangement, featuring yellow iris, accessories permitted
6. FUN AND GAMES -  
for Juniors only, accessories permitted

## AWARDS

### RIBBONS

First, second, third place & Honorable Mention ribbons will be awarded in each class as merited, except Seedling Class J.

Sweepstakes rosettes will be awarded in Horticulture and Artistic divisions.

Queen of Show rosette will be awarded in Horticulture.

Best Arrangement rosette will be awarded.

Best Seedling of Show rosette will be awarded.

Best Specimen of Show, Junior Division and

Best Arrangement of Show, Junior Division, rosettes will be awarded.

### MEDALS

Silver Medal of the American Iris Society will be given to the person winning the highest number of First Place ribbons in the Horticulture Division.

Bronze Medal of the American Iris Society will be given to the person winning the second highest number of First Place ribbons in the Horticulture Division.

### TROPHIES

A trophy will be awarded to the exhibitor winning Queen of Show. For permanent possession, this trophy must be won three times by the same exhibitor, not necessarily consecutively. Returnable annually to the Sun Country Iris Society until won permanently, the names of the winners will be engraved on the trophy each year, and a replica will be presented to the exhibitor.
