

Complete upper and lower portions of each entry tag as follows:

- <u>Section</u> as listed in each Division. Where sub-sections are listed, include the number on the same line.
  - <u>Class</u> only as listed for Collections and Artistic Designs.
- <u>Variety</u> name of iris or title of artistic entry.

Entry No. - as assigned to each exhibitor.

The information on the lower portion of the tag will be used to determine the Sweepstakes winners and to complete official show reports.

#### GENERAL RULES

- Exhibition privileges are open to all persons without charge.
- 2. Entries will be accepted April 15th from 6:30 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.
- Containers will be furnished, except for the artistic classes.
- 4. Exhibitors may enter no more than one specimen of the same named variety, with the exception of the collection classes.
- 5. Horticultural entries must have been grown and entered in person by the exhibitor.
- Entries placed on the show bench will be judged as groomed by the exhibitor.
- 7. Entries must be correctly, clearly and completely identified and entered in the proper division, section and class; or they will not be judged.
- 8. Single specimen entries will be staged by cultivar (variety). Placement in sections/sub-sections will be in alphabetical order of variety name. Each variety is a separate class for judging.
- Judging will be by AIS rules, with decisions of the judges final. Any award may be withheld at the judges' discretion.
- 10. No judge or designated apprentice may judge in a section where the judge or a member of the judge's family has an entry.
- 11. Official rules and regulations of AIS cannot be violated.
- 12. Judging will begin at 10 a.m. April 15th. Only judges, designated apprentices, clerks and show chairmen are permitted in the exhibit area during the judging.
- 13. Entries may be groomed by the show committee or the exhibitor anytime after the judging is completed.
- 14. Exhibits and ribbons must remain on display until 4 p.m. April 16th but must be removed by 5 p.m.
- 15. Sun Country Iris Society assumes no responsibility for loss or damage but will do all possible to safeguard exhibits.



Section J - SEEDLINGS

An unintroduced iris of any section to be designated by name or number and entered in the hybridizer's name.

Section K - COLLECTIONS

A collection consists of three stalks. Exhibitors may enter more than one collection in each class but each collection must be different, i.e. TB, SPU, LA. Complete entry tags for each variety.

Class 1 - Same type, same variety

Class 2 - Same type, three different varieties

## DIVISION II - ARTISTIC DESIGN

#### SPECIAL RULES

- All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
   Exhibitors are limited to one entry per class.
- Iris must be used in all arrangements and must be the predominating feature. Except where specified, iris of any kind may be used. Though not required, iris used may be identified on a separate card.
- 3. Dry or treated natural plant material is acceptable but fresh material must predominate. No artificial plant material may be used.
- Irises and plant material need not have been grown by the exhibitor.
- 5. The use of interpretive accessories is permitted. Use is required only if specified for a class.
- 6. No background boards may be used except in specified classes. Where specified, backboards will be furnished by the Show Committee.
- 7. Containers should be marked on the underside with the owner's name and address.
- 8. Exhibitors are responsible for maintaining arrangements in fresh and groomed condition for the duration of the show, and removing exhibits promptly at the close of the show.
- Sun Country Iris Society assumes no responsibility for loss or damage, but will do all possible to safeguard exhibits.

- Section B For Novices only (No first place ribbons won in previous shows).
  - Class 1 SIMPLY BEAUTIFUL
    Arrangement featuring one iris stalk;
    choice of foliage, fresh only.
- Section C Open to All.
  - Class 1 NATURAL BEAUTY
    Accessories of weathered wood, or other
    objects from nature.
  - Class 2 I FEEL PRETTY
    A combination of plant textures.
  - Class 3 PRETTY AS A PITCHER
    Arrangement in a pitcher or watering can.
  - Class 4 BEAUTY IS IN THE EYE OF THE BEHOLDER Free interpretation.

## DIVISION III - YOUTH

Youth is defined as 18 years and younger. Entries will be judged in two age groups:

Y1 - Under 12 years

Y2 - 12 through 18 years

Mark your entry tag for your age group in the upper left corner.

All exhibits must be related to irises, iris culture or hybridizing.

Horticultural materials, if used, need not have been grown by the exhibitor.

Space required must be reserved by April 8th. Call Gloria Beatty, 846-0412; or Carole Spiess, 246-1743.

The AIS Educational Certificate and Bronze Medal may be awarded to the exhibitor of an educational exhibit found to be of outstanding merit by the judges of the show.


