To encourage interest in cultivation of irises, the ideal hardy perennial:

To provide an opportunity for fair and friendly competition; and,

To create an atmosphere of wonder and beauty for the pleasure of all.

MEMBERSHIP IN THE SUN COUNTRY IRIS SOCIETY, AS WELL AS THE AMERICAN IRIS SOCIETY IS OPEN TO ALL PERSONS INTERESTED IN GROWING IRISES, REGARDLESS OF SKILL OR EXPERIENCE.

FREE IRISES OF YOUR CHOICE WORTH \$10.00 (LIST PRICE) WILL BE GIVEN IN THE FALL TO ANYONE JOINING OUR CLUB DURING THIS SHOW.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. Exhibition privileges are open to all persons.
- 2. Entries will be accepted from 6:30 until 9:30 a.m., on Friday, April 13.
- 3. Single-specimen entries are to be staged alphabetically, by cultivar, rather than by color, with each named variety constituting a separate class, and judged as such.
- 4. Horticulture exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- 5. An exhibitor may enter no more than one of the same variety.
- 6. Exhibits must be correctly named and labeled. Irises not named or improperly identified will not be judged. Entry numbers should appear on tag-stub only, NOT on upper portion of tag. Tag-stub information will be used in determining the horticulture sweepstakes winner therefore, the cultivar name and identity of exhibitor must be shown on stub. Tags and entry tabulation forms may be obtained in advance from Mary Scheidler (841-1125) or Floyd Wickenkamp (977-2354).
- 7. Youth see special rules under Division III.
- 8. Judging will be by American Iris Society rules, with decisions of judges final, and any award withheld at their discretion.
- 9. No persons are to be allowed in exhibit area during judging except judges, show chairman, clerks and designated student judges.
- 10. Judging is to begin at 10:00 a.m., Friday April 13.
- 11. The classification committee may combine, create, or separate classes as necessary.
- 12. Sun Country assumes no responsibility for loss or damage, but will do all possible to safeguard exhibits.
- 13. Faded stalks may be groomed or removed by the show committee or exhibitor any time after judging.

- 14. Containers will be furnished except for the artistic classes and collections (class a).
- 15. Trophies will be awarded Saturday, April 14, after 4:30 p.m. Ribbons and artistic designs must be removed that same day between 4:30 and 5:00 p.m.

ARTISTIC DESIGN RULES

- 1. One entry only to a class.
- 2. No artificial plant material may be used.
- 3. Dried or treated natural plant material is acceptable, but frest material should predominate.
- 4. Plant material need not have been grown by exhibitor (unless specified in class).
- 5. One or more irises must be used in each arrangement and should be the dominating feature of a design.
- 6. Except where specified, irises of any kind may be used.
- 7. Though not required, exhibitors may identify irises used in arrangements (on entry tag or separate card).
- 8. Exhibitor's name should appear on underside of container.
- 9. Exhibitor should keep arrangement fresh.
- 10. A novice is defined as a person who has never won a blue ribbon in an artistic class at an IRIS show.
- 11. It is suggested that no background boards be used.

DIVISION II - ARTISTIC DESIGN

All designs, except where specified, are to be Arranger's choice.

Class 1 - "MUCH ADO ABOUT NOTHING"

Small arrangement - not to be over 6" tall (including container).

Class 2 - "AS YOU LIKE IT"

Open interpretation.

Class 3 - "THE COMEDY OF ERRORS"

Open interpretation.

Class 4 - "LOVE'S LABOR LOST"

Open interpretation.

Class 5 - "MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM"

Fragrance will be considered in judging this class.

Class 6 - "ALL'S WELL THAT END'S WELL"

Large centerpiece arrangement. Balance most important.

Class 7 - "THE WINTER'S TALE"

Arrangement should contain white iris.

Class 8 - "MEASURE FOR MEASURE"

A design of symetry and balance. A modern-style arrangement; open only to previous winners of Best Arrangement or Artistic Sweepstakes in an IRIS SHOW.

DIVISION III - YOUTH

RULES:

- Youth is defined as those under 18 years of age. Youth entries will be subdivided into two age groups:

 (a) under 12
 (b) 12 and over
- 2. Artistic designs and horticulture entries for YOUTH ONLY will be accepted between 8:00 and 8:30 p.m. on Thursday, April 12.

SECTION A - HORTICULTURE:

Class 1 - Tall Bearded

Class 2 - Any other

SECTION B - ARTISTIC DESIGN:

Class 1 - "ROMEO & JULIET"

- Class 2 "PHOENIX & THE TURTLE"
- Class 3 "THE TWELFTH NIGHT; or, WHAT YOU WILL"

All designs are interpretive. Accessories are permitted, but arrangement should predominate.

AWARDS

RIBBONS:

First, second, third place and honorable mention ribbons will be awarded in each class as merited. except Seedling Class.

MEDALS:

Silver medal of the American Iris Society will be given to the person winning the highest number of first place ribbons in the Horticulture Division.

Bronze medal of the American Iris Society will be given to the person winning the second highest number of first place ribbons in the Horticulture Division.

SECTION CERTIFICATES:

To be awarded if A.I.S. qualifications are met - that is, a minimum of five classes per section, three exhibitors per section. and three entries per class.

TROPHIES:

1) Queen of Show

For permanent possession, this trophy won three times by the same exhibitor, not necessarily consecutively. It is returnable annually to the Sun Country Iris Society until won permanently. Names of winners will be engraved on the trophy each year, with a keepsake trophy going to the exhibitor.
